














Organization	Project	Activity
Kenan Foundation	Senior got talent	Train the retired seniors to earn for a living, such as skills to use Facebook in online business, business model canvas, online market, product analysis to meet consumers demands.
	Just job network	Match pre-ageing women (45-year-old) who leave work to take care of their parents with the flexible job to earn for a living.
Foundation for Older Persons' Development	Buddy Home Care	Home care for the older persons on a volunteer basis and generate income for youth (intergenerational support).
	DRRNet	Promote participation of the older persons in disaster risk reduction whether natural or man-made disasters. Older persons can use wisdom, skill, experience to help community where they live.
Department of Older Persons	Older Persons' Online Marketplace	Provide online platform for older persons to sell the products and reach to customers online.

Problem and Solution



Disadvantaged youths

- Hill tribes in remote areas
- High school dropout rate
- Lack opportunities to pursue higher education
- Can only secure low-income jobs



Poor disadvantaged elderly

- Bed-ridden or home-bound
- Children work in cities unable to provide care needed
- Lack access to health services
 - → Overlooked health problems
 - → Poor physical and mental health




Solution

- Provide disadvantaged youths with training and employment as caregivers
- Provide elderly with cost-effective and high quality home care
- Develop volunteer-based care services for disadvantaged elderly

Business & Revenue Model

Training of disadvantaged youths



 Disadvantaged youths receive full scholarship for 420-hr caregiver training program

Employment as caregivers



- Trainees hired by Buddy
 Homecare as full time employees
 to administer home care services
- Around 10% salary is deducted for 3 years to reimburse cost of training

Volunteer home care scheme



 Caregivers are assigned to provide free home care service to disadvantaged elderly as part of their job

Monetization

Care Services Packages

- Monthly Service
 - 8 hours per day
 - 24 days per month
 Start with 15,000 THB
- Daily Service
 - 8 hours per day Start with 800 THB

40 customers x 15,000 THB = 600,000 THB per month



Salary

Start with 10,000 THB (Social welfare included)

45 caregivers x 10,000 THB = 450,000 THB per month




