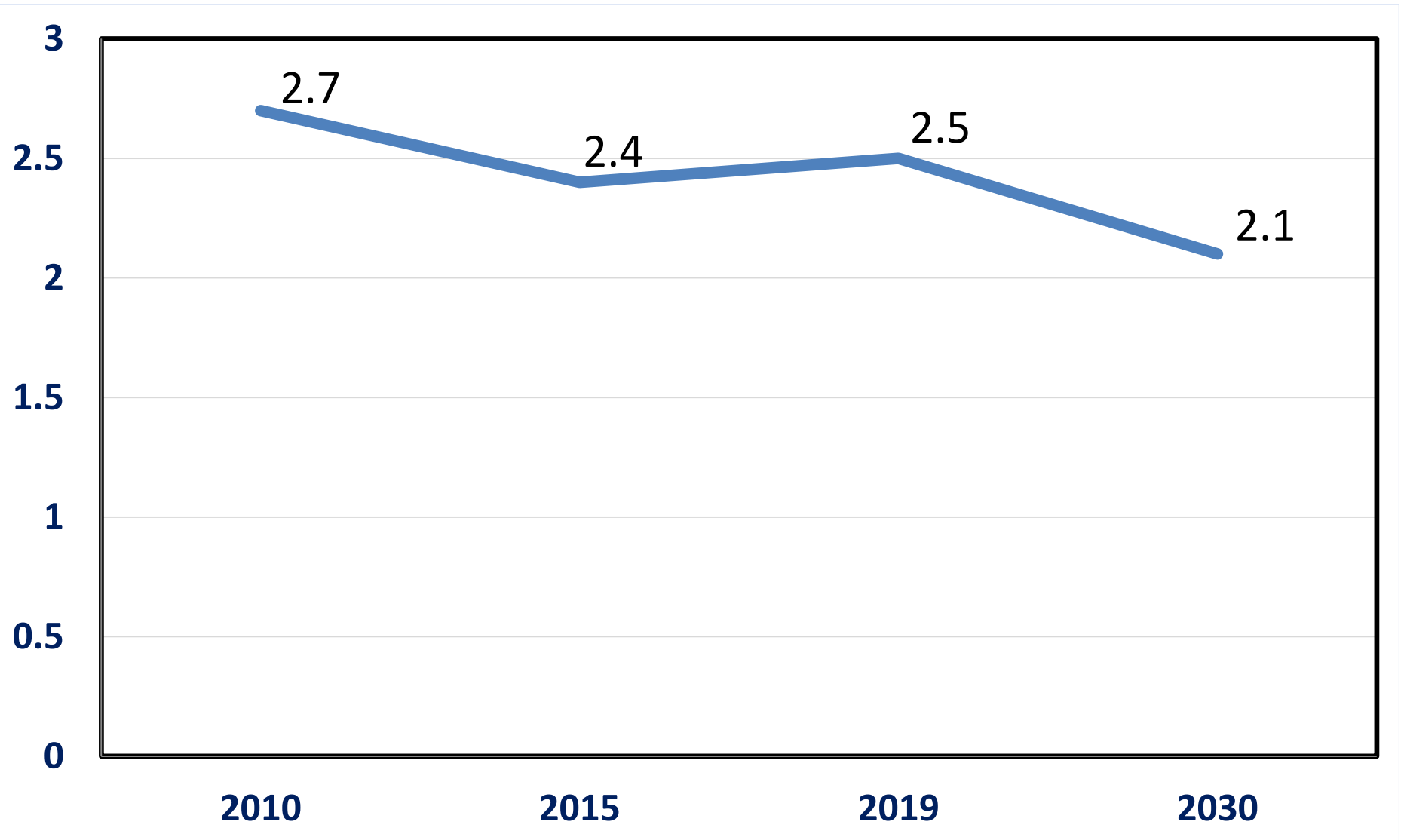

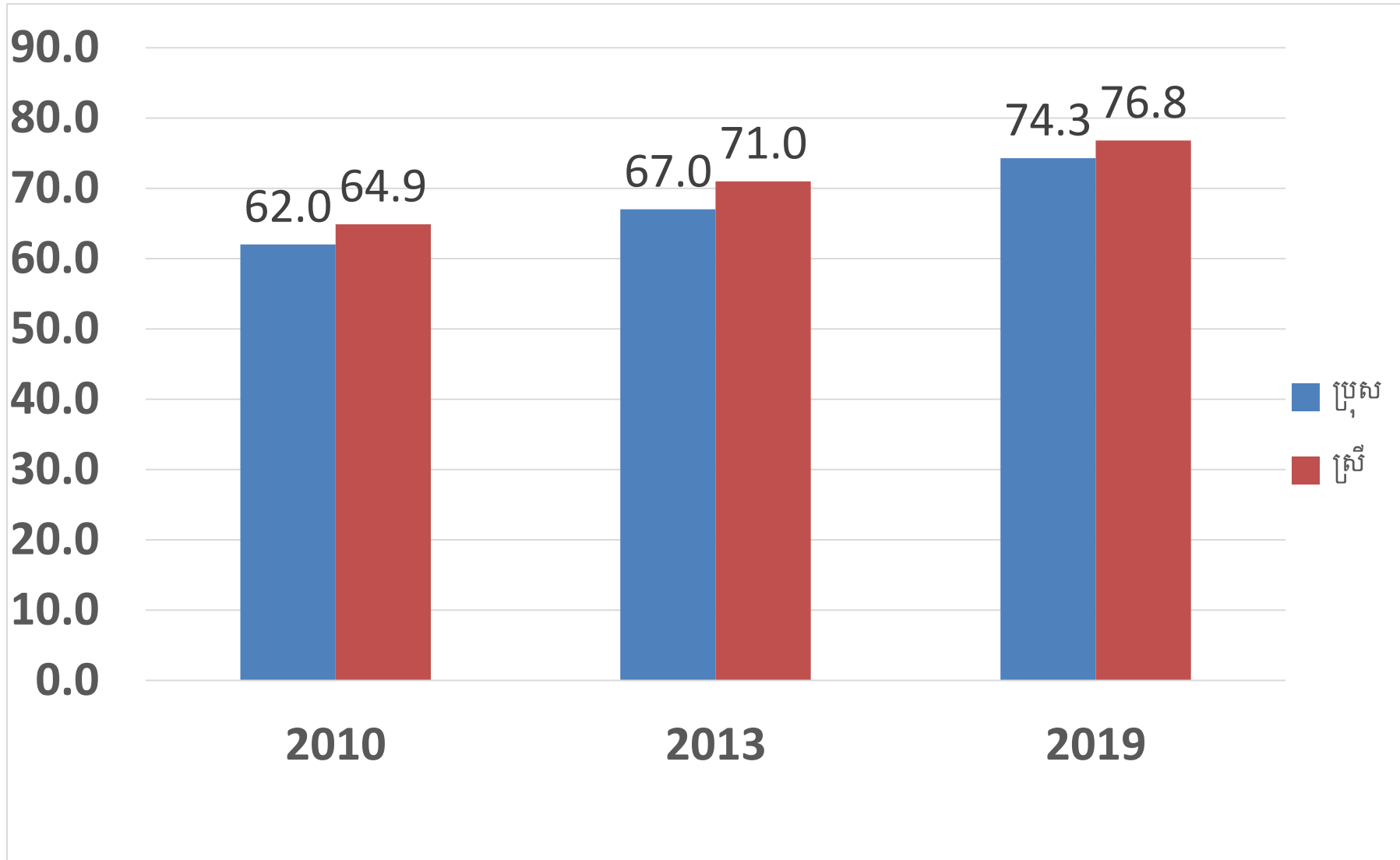
AGEING SITUATION

- Total Population 15 522 211 in 2019
- Total of Elderly 1 384 146 equal 8.9% of Total Population
- Two factors explain the emergence of population ageing – declining fertility and improving life expectancy.

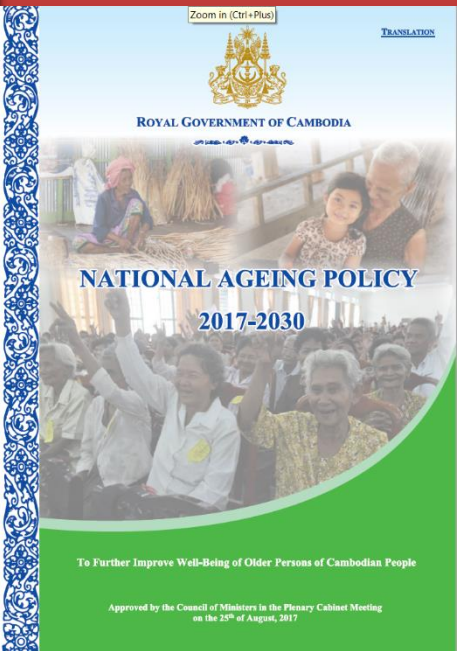
Fertility Rate

National Ageing Policy



- Launched on 18 January 2018 by SAMDACH AKKE MOHA SENA PADEY TECHO HUN SEN Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Cambodia
- The Policy is an overarching roadmap formulated for addressing the wide range of issues emerging from the evolving ageing situation within the broad national development framework, including the Rectangular Strategy Phase III, the National Strategic Development Plan 2019-2023 and National Population Policy 2016-2030

National Ageing Policy (Cont')

- Vision:

To continuously enhance and improve the quality of life of older persons in Cambodia with emphasis on ensuring their equal rights and opportunities.

- Two Goals:

- 1) To ensure that older persons are enabled to fully participate with freedom and dignity for as long as they wish to in family, community, economic, social, religious and political activities
- 2) To ensure that younger persons are better equipped with knowledge that enables them to lead a more productive, healthy, active and dignified life in old age.

Regulations during Covid-19

- Sub-Decree No.88, on the Implementation of Supported Fund to the Poor and the Vulnerable Families in Covid-19
- Decision No. 023 MEF dated 13 May 2021 on the Mechanisms and Procedures for the Implementation of the Post-Closing Cash Social Assistance Program for Citizens and Families with Difficult Livelihoods, Citizens and Citizens' Families Covid-19 infected people and families with Covid- 19 deaths in the February 20, 2021 event
- Message on the start of the provision of cash support under the "post-closure social assistance program for the people and their families who have financial difficulties, the people and their families who are infected with Covid-19 and have Livelihood difficulties and families of people who died of Covid-19 in the event of February 20, 2021
