

Recommendation

To promote **home-grown platforms** that can cater to home-based workers who operate as individuals, or to those who lack bargaining power.

The home-grown platform will not only benefit economy, but it will also promote informal workers' access basic social services



Promote job equity among vulnerable people



Benefits from online gig work tend to vary depending on the intersection of many factors, including gender, education and skill level, and

socioeconomic class

The low-skilled, lower class women [cleaners, masseuses] are among the most vulnerable





- Associated with low social status, leave them with low self-esteem.
- Require to stand by at home, waiting to be called in to work.
 The standby is part of the women's work hours, but not be paid.
- Concerns over the health, safety, and sexual harassment risks due to their working conditions

Recommendation

Remain other groups, such as low-skilled labor **migrants and the digitally illiterate**, that could be entirely excluded from the system in the first place.

The development of Informal Workers Protection Act

"All uninsured persons above 15 years of age are protected by this law. The act ensures the rights to registration, rights to association, and potentially financial access to the Home-Based Workers Fund."


"The labor relationship between platform workers and platforms do not deviate from that of non-platform informal workers, and this distinction should be taken into serious consideration."
